



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D.I.Y: Yarn and Button Holiday Topiaries





et a little help from the kids to create these cheery Christmas topiaries. Great as a centrepiece or mantel or foyer decoration, these yarn-covered trees will add a colourful pop to any room.

Materials Needed:

- 3 foam cones (small, medium and large)
- 3 different colours of yarn
- Assortment of medium and large buttons
- Hot glue gun and hot glue
- Assortment of large pom-poms
- Scissors

Glue Yarn

Use hot glue to secure the loose end of a ball of yarn to the bottom of a foam cone.

Wrap Yarn

Continue to tightly wrap the entire cone with yarn. Cut off the end once you've reached the top and secure it to the top of the cone with a dab of hot glue.

Attach Pom-Pom and Buttons

Attach a large pom-pom to the cone's top with hot glue. Cover the cone with a variety of medium and large buttons, attaching them with hot glue.



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According to G. Double. E the COVID-19 pandemic affected a lot of artists, and non-artists alike. Well, to him it affected his anticipated projects in terms of releasing new songs, gigs have come to a halt as well as his botched marketing strategies. Yet, currently he is trying his best to use social media to put his head over-the-water so that he doesn't drown in obscurity. He's doing everything to survive this year to save his musical career. In order to stay relevant, G. Double. E releases online and uses all kinds of social media platforms to share with many people. He also shoots videos to be shared online. Owing to that, he said; "my performances are chronicled online since more people spend time on their smart phones to pass out time and chase out boredom. We do so to keep them entertained plus keeping the pandemonium swinging so that our names do not fade into oblivion."

His journey in music dates back to the year 2009, when he developed the love for music. He would write songs about his life experiences, and listened to them as if someone was talking to him. Also, he admitted that he uses music as a therapy... when it worked for him, he started taking it seriously. He takes stock of what is happening in other people's lives, then he starts talking to them through his music.

Who inspired you?

He was inspired by Ghana artist Sarkodie. I have been his fan for a long time and started knowing him with his hit single 'Original'. His words in the song talks about believing in himself, and how he is never going to change-but still going to make it by being original dishing out rap lyrics with his original vernacular. I loved his astound passion and work ethics he portrayed throughout the song.

How would you describe your sound?

My sound is totally different, I honestly do a certain number of genres. I do the genres that are trending just for survival, and equally balancing it with the notion to gain more fans. I do Motswako that is way too different using urban afro and local house kwasa sound, coupled with a different approach of rap and singing.

What is your creative process like?

My creative process, I am a very creative person. I do songs about reality and occurrences in our daily lives. It can be something that happened to me or anyone else I know, even the social ills that befell the whole world. I have my album ready to drop anytime. But now I'm just waiting for the right time and until recent my focus was just dropping singles for now. Whom do you envy, and yet you'd like to collaborate with in future?

I would really love to collaborate with Rihanna, Nasty C, Beyoncé, Sarkodie, Eminem, Tinashe Casper and Kamo Mphela.

Have you ever dealt with performance anxiety?

Of course, it's a big Yes! I've dealt with anxiety back in the days when it was my first time performing my first song ever, that was my first appearance on stage at Babusi hall. When I went on stage upbeat with the song called "A la nkutlwa" I was greeted with a cold response as the whole crowd just went out of the hall at the peak of my song. I came on stage to perform after the number one was announced, it was moments after a certain lady was crowned 'Miss Black Diamond' in a hotlycontested beauty pageant. It all started when I performed and the audience stood up, packed their stuff and tracked outside the hall. I could hear them murmuring and chatting disgruntled messages as they trickled outside the hall premises. It was really a bad and a painful experience for me, such that I got traumatized for over two years without doing any music. I hibernated and went into absentia soon after that-only to surface the beginning of 2020. On a comeback trail I performed

alongside Zanda Zakuza (SA) at BUAN and I was on fire this time around, I killed it.

How are you coping with the current Coronavirus situation?

Just like any other artists elsewhere, corona virus has shut so many doors in our face.

How do you keep your fans entertained on social media?

I'm keeping them busy with sharing my everyday life events and pushing my merchandise. I inform them about the upcoming songs I'm dropping as singles. I'm building that momentum so now they're ready for the bounce back of the entertainment industry. I do so to keep them on their toes until when the curtain is raised, so they will appreciate seeing me getting back on stage. The good news is I have hot singles awaiting to be dropped on December 2020, an EP to drop on 2021 as well as an Album.

Were you prepared for survival, if not? What are you doing today for survival? Honestly, I wasn't prepared. My passion is just in music, acting and commercial modeling or something along that line. So, for survival now I'm pushing ads for companies, acting in short local films and television series that are yet to drop soon. There is this one international advert I did with Sharon Seno aka Marang from Muvhango for Zebranet; and it opened more connections for me so now I'm a freelancer. I do ads and promos for known and unknown entities. Some of my works were made for: *Chichi Diamond clothing, Shmir clothing line, Chosen Design, Pusha Hustle Clothing line as well as Kapari Clan.

What are you currently doing for survival apart from music?

I am yet to do some promos for food and beverage entities (Restaurants) too. Am calling out for companies and individuals to use me to market them as I can also shoot a music video featuring whatever the services they are offering.

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NOOKAA Defying The Odds With Comedy

The comedy industry in Botswana is rapidly growing; as more comedians rise to the occasion to showcase raw talent. As our country is blessed to have multiple social media platforms; they come handy in helping these comedians reach their target audience. Commentators, opinion leaders and pessimists may conclude that

leaders and pessimists may conclude that 'Entertainment Industry' is on its deathbed, no one can dispute that; because it's now in the public domain that entertainers face a bleak future ahead. Tough times humble them every day-in the wake up of the corona virus pandemic. However, some defy odds and never cease to amuse people. Ntonka uses his unusual wit coupled with deadpan deliveries to amuse his audience.

Celebrity World Magazine took to the streets to intermingle with one of the celebrated comedians, Ntonka. The man anointed with funnier jokes came as a dark horse in stand-up comedy. He spews out jokes to the amusement of audiences, leaving them perplexed and rolling with fits of laughter. The 2020 pandemic, that ruined many precious plans came as a windfall for him. As we know everyone home-bound during recurring was lockdowns, passing out time watching their videos on social media platforms. He seized the moment, and in no time became one of the fastest growing brands during the State of Emergency (SOE). Nothing could stop him from reaching his dreams; he unlocked his potential further, by collaborating with other comedians and that worked in their favour.

Ntonka, born-Raymond Johane Kegomoditswe, became one of Batswana's favourite funny man instantaneously. He broke loose and emerged from the cocoon as a new hatchling in the aftermath of COVID-19 crisis. It was after the first lockdown that he took his talent more seriously, his efforts paid off as he got more recognition. His sudden rise to fame afforded himself rare time to collaborate with other established creatives. Rousing from his slumber, in no time he created content which he posted on facebook to entertain people from the comfort of their homes. He regards himself as a jack-of-all trades kind of comedian; he does both stand-up comedy and vines. But his breakthrough came from vines; since live interactive comedy shows were barred, as they were deemed to attract large gatherings. Such an optimistic individual, who never drains out to look only at the bright side of things more than anything.

Growing up, he used to look up to Odirile Vee Sento, aka "Vee Mampeezy." He vividly remembers seeing him perform in local TV shows like Mokaragana.

"I was introduced to him by Maatla Ephraim Basha; and I knew from that moment I had to do my level-best, not only to impress him but also to impress other big brands, different stakeholders, parastatals, and the whole world at large," said Ntonka.

He is still hoping to work with other local big names in the likes of Motsetserepa and Mjamaica. On international stage he likes Dave Chappell, Martin Lawrence, Will Smith and Steve Harvey, and gauging through their rising to stardom- they gave him a notion that anything is possible.

During his school days students were treated to his hegemony in telling jokes. He always left them bedraggled in tears of laughter. Those who were moreintelligent than him, always attended their study time at his class; because they were ambushed by his sense of humour. They often had to contend helping him with his assignments, so that in return he can crack jokes for them at their dismay. To him, it was amazing because it just came naturally. He will throw a jab of a joke and people would break out in giggles.

He said his comedy is not only about money, but healing the world and making it a better place for those who go through some tough times. **"Some people take life seriously and when their expectations are not met, they are depressed**," he observed. One good thing which he is grateful for, is the support and encouragements his twin brother provides. "People are beginning to understand

comedy; and see its importance and how it contributes to our total well-being. They also appreciate how it even contribute immensely to the growth of our economy" says Ntonka. As far as he is concerned, the contribution of our economy should not only emerge from our academic abilities and prowess in sports; comedy is also the solution.

His tone suddenly changes into a sombre mode as he recalls how comedians are ill-treated and taken for a ride. "As comedians, we are a small community and we are easily exploited because of our poor academic backgrounds." He indicated that, this happens because comedians lack basic computer writing skills. They don't know how to write good proposals for themselves; which make them easily fall prey of exploiters. He cited a case of some big brands, who have a tendency of not honouring their agreements with them. He attributed that most of this 'exploitation' is selfinflicted. "Comedians are always fighting and sabotaging each other for the sake of spotlight," he stressed out. He was steadfast to say, "instead of working together, because united we stand ... divided we fall," people opt to be selfish and self-centred. He emphasized, every artist must look into the bigger picture; because at the end of the day they're trying to push comedy and expose their talent to people and the whole world, while at the same time representing Botswana at an international level. He took a swipe at comedians and said; "when we're united it does not benefit us alone but rather the country at large." He gave examples with key values of Botho and Tshwaragano-the basic principles and moral values that guide the nation; saying they will be realised.

He reiterated that, "the big favour that they can do themselves is to support each other through collaborations." They ought to believe in each other's ideas. If there is a dissenting voice for example, one of the comedians might not like a certain joke; they'd rather develop it as a team and see how best they can execute it in a palatable manner. Furthermore, he said knowing each other's strengths and weaknesses make everything easier for them to work together. They can even know who is suitable to portray certain portions in a script. When pressured about issues of conflicting ideas, Ntonka was quick to mention that everyone has his or her own way of doing things. He stated that he is not in a position to pour scorn 'that someone is not doing something right or wrong.' **"People are entitled** to own opinions and views, but we mustn't forget that everyone has their own path," he suggested.

According to him comedy skill is something



that one can be born with and you can also learn it. Also, it depends on the kind of people you interact with because whether we like it or not, they influence us somehow and as for Ntonka he said; "it's something that he was born with and developed it through the passage of time." He decried that, the little support that the government is doing to support entertainment industry is not enough. We only rub shoulders with state during the presidential competitions. Worse enough, only five comedians benefit from such, "how about the rest?" he quizzed. He queried that comedians' lives should not revolve around competitions which comes once in a year.


Fortunately, Ntonka appreciates the fact that his fans are doing their best to support him. He spotted the love and all kind gestures emanating from his fans;

something that keeps him poised. "It fuels up the desire to keep on going even though it's not an easy journey to embark on," said the funny man. He acknowledged that 'fans hire them in the shows, parties and events they organize.' He lauded that as something because it keeps his lights on; they even go to the extent of buying his merchandise. The man who proved his cynics wrong, just oozes laughter to his over-enthusiastic crowd effortlessly. Comedy is his lifeblood. His advice to aspiring comedians is to learn before they earn. The mistakes they commit should be taken as a learning lesson, "mistakes and experiences build us more than anything," he quipped.



He recently released a new gospel music video titled "Rato La Hao". Eric stated that, he is also the Public Relations Officer (PRO) for Miss Christian Botswana pageant. His stewardship saw them winning Miss Christian Africa 2020 crown.

Having been in the music industry

for a long time, Kabelo stated that, 'he has witnessed his artistic talent and creativity growing in a tremendous way.' Also being a recognized international figure-it gives a testimony about how he evolved as an artist. When talking about the status of Botswana gospel music, he highlighted that it has grown rapidly. There is constant improvement when juxtaposed with music of other religions worldwide. The music started with lot of rich traditional gospel, but now there is an amazing trend. We see growth and transformation to contemporary gospel. Home-grown gospel artists have been recognized and honoured internationally. Gospel legends that comes to the picture being: Matthews Matsetse and Tshepo Lesole were nominated in the international awards. Not only that, also youthful artists like Masego Motswiri, Leah Motlogelwa make the cut of even receiving international awards. So, this is an indication of how this country is blessed with roaring talent. The youth are a strong force to reckon with, as they have turned the tide topsy-turvy...in the process breaking ceilings, to showcase the world what we have at our disposal.

To him music is the best way to communicate how he feels inwardly. Sharing his personal experiences with the world lift people's souls. Consequently it gives him joy and fulfilment. His view is to create new music, something relevant to the rhythm of live and unfolding events. He creates music that reverberates with social, political and spiritual current affairs. Mister Eric has become the pivot of hope, courage and a fountain of love as the world salivates for him. He strongly believes in his musical dream. He openly declares, "I still hold the best gift ever." Notwithstanding the challenges he faced; he was adamant his self-belief attracted positive energy to his talent

Taking us through a glance of his most memorable moments, he wryly says; "my most memorable moments in my career thus far, was recording my first album. Secondly, overhearing my first song relayed on radio and obviously the wowmoment I won my first international award in New York City, USA, in 2011." The gospel legend will be releasing his international collaboration with Rwandan popular gospel artist, Serge Iyamuremwe this month. The purpose-driven songbird is also eyeing on various possibilities to diversify his talent. He has added another genre in his line of music, and he is currently doing finishing touches on his Afro Soul album-to be released on the 14th of February, 2021..





One of the things we love about your work is your

What advice would you give other young designers hoping to make it in the fashion world?

Everything is energy! Place your attention on what you love and love what you do, passion will show in your work regardless of what it is. I love life and I love people so I spend time watching and listening, learning how to bring more consciousness to what we wear.

Going back to your university days, or maybe even before that, when did your personal journey in fashion begin?

My journey began in Sloane Street in Knightsbridge London working in Courtier for Tomasz Starzewski whose clients where Margarette Thatcher...Shirley Bassey,Ivana Trump, Queen Noor of Jordon to name but a few ...leading on to open a ready-to-wear store in Lowndes Square called Bissous...and so in Gaborone we sold Italian labels such as Roberto Cavalli...I then went to live in Borsa Turkey consulting in manufacturing. Summing all these up, lead me to create my own collection.

The big question we keep hearing is whether or not the established fashion system can actually pivot to being sustainable do you think that's possible? Or do we need to scrap it and start over? Upon returning from living abroad for many years... noticing we don't have a lot of shopping options. I ventured into the line of shopping which I thought would be easy, fun and also, I would have more options. However, I couldn't find the items I wanted in one place and it became very complicated. I then thought of the things I love and how I could get them in my dress to please myself-using the sun and a muse to inspire what we wear

Tell us about your sustainable jewelry business and the journey behind the collection of the crystal, stones etc.

I love collecting the gemstones

and the energy they carry. I started growing interest in collecting them as far as I can remember-around the age of 3. My dad gave me an amethyst which I still have today...at the time he was a Civil Engineer building roads and bridges in Zambia; and he used to bring home gemstones from work. Living in London for many years I began to miss the bush, and started using elements like grass, wood, greenery, stones & gemstones to decorate my living space and ground myself... Metaphysics & Reki enable me to use gemstones with purpose to heal and rise my vibration. I would make and wear gemstone rings and anytime someone likes it, I would gift them as crystals when I have to travel. 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Desiree Ferrari's Cutting Edge Of Breathwork

he speaks with passion and vigour. A towering figure with a lanky body frame. Her interview is punctuated with bouts of maniac laughter in between. Her devotion to her job is sterling and

you won't even think she went through a rough patch. The moment she opens pandoras box, you'll realize the woman went through a torrid past. Just like any divorcee she had to contend with psychological problems such as low self-esteem, shock, denial, anger, panic, depression, guilt and self-criticism. The nature of divorce is uncertain, gutwrenching, destructive, awful, devastating and very traumatic. Most of us cannot rationally handle the complex and emotional questions involved in a divorce. A sizeable number of victims would be escaping through excess such as drugs and alcohol consumption. She overcame a seething anger that normally lead people to commit suicides in the aftermath of a painful divorce. However, despite the ordeal Miss Desiree Ferrari, she healed with time and now she's leaving her dream as a Professional Breathing Therapist. She emerged very strong from resentment and rade.

Celebrity World Magazine Editor Itumeleng Moterati, captured an interview verbatim i.e. word for-word from Desiree Ferrari's mouth to unpack her bumpy road leading to the genesis of breathwork, and how she toiled around on her journey to becoming a professional Breath Therapist. With a piercing smile, she paces through an interview eloquently. Her voice reassures that no matter obstacles piled against us, we can succeed and emerge victorious.

Would you introduce yourself, what you cover as a professional, start in a vague and narrow down the scope of your work? My name is Desiree Ferrari, I am 53 and I say that proudly. I wasn't a good learner at school...nothing much went in my head and I literally failed form three at GSS. The reason I say that is now I have a bachelor of Science Degree (BSc) and I'm doing my PHD and there's hope for us all. The reason I mention that is, I've been working in the fashion industry for many years and I've worked with high profile people, who paid as much as \$10 000 per dress worn for only one time, and they weren't happy and I was confused. I thought that if someone can buy a dress for that whopping amount, they can turn out to be happy. Anyway, after working there for four years I got sick. I got a depression and anxiety such that doctors didn't have a clue of what sickness I was suffering from. I ended up leaving. Upon leaving I just had a weird thought that if you don't look well outside then you have to go in. "So what did we need to do to go inside?" Because I wasn't a good learner I couldn't go back to school because that was my biggest nightmare. "How I am I going to do a shortcut to how to healing and work with people around me?" I was a single parent at that time with two teenage sons and they used to come with their friends. And there was confusion and you know when I was that age, I wanted to meet Michael Jackson. I wanted to do this and that. These kids had so many options but they didn't know what they would do in the next hour, so that triggered me to go out and do something, so this was around 2006. So, all the newspapers in London will have this coaching... come for free coaching. So, I went to every free session available and by then I didn't know what I was doing, and what coaching meant. It was like it takes 3-6 months, and I can help people. So, I embarked on becoming a coach, which I realized it took me a whole year and a whole lot of other things I would not have done. When I came home, I was able to help my sons, I was able to help other people within my vicinity. Which is all I wanted to do. I was coming to the point where I was getting ok now after getting sick, after divorce and so many things going on in my life. Everything was falling apart and coaching helped me a lot to balance and keep things together, and then I went to Turkey to work in a health spa, and in a health spa they don't eat. They sort of flush your system so there is no food whatsoever so you can stay there for 40 days without eating, so you just come on television, so they call it spa embarrassing illnesses. So, I remember it was channel 125. Anyway people would go there extremely-ill because it's that kind of last straw, so people would like come there burned from Exim and they would clean out the system, what I did then was I coached people because if you're not eating even for one or two days you'll start coming out. People will start lying and crying out, what I realize is people would be there for 4 days, seven days or 2 weeks then they would go.

So, it wasn't enough as coaching would have taken 3-6 months, if you're properly certified with International Coaching Federation, you only get six sessions and it has to end in a period of time. It cannot continue therefore I could not use those skills. It was just not good for those lying around and feeling sad and all of that, but how would I know that when they went home things will change for the better? So, I kind of like shortcuts even if it's a thorn bush I like to go that way to get to the other side, so I figured out what can we do so that when people leave, they would be better for sure, so I did other things. I did tapping which is EFT Emotion technique Tapping where you tap meridians of the body and it changes...it's an amazing tool though it's a little bit crazy and ridiculous. I did a bit of hypnosis, I did rekey-which is emotional healing and then I came across a lady who was working as a Breathing Therapist in spa in Turkey, so I was like wow what is that! So, she took me for seven days without eating because I was also in the program. I had a session every day for seven days, so when you don't eat oh my goodness! you can go to places that you cannot imagine. Within that seven days I had cleared almost everything that I carried in my life. You know I was going to Jesus on the cross, so I realized that this is me, so my time was up. What am I going to do as I return back to London? So, I was thinking what I'm going to do, so this was about me... how am I going to continue. It was just about me; it was not something I would earn money with. I just enioved clearing my stuff so it took me 2 years after that. In 2009 I managed to find a Breathing Therapist who did the same modality as the first one I met in turkey, so I would go to them and eventually they got fed up of me, saying you can't keep on coming back to us because this is one tool that is a self-healing tool. There is no dependency, so you keep on coming back something is not right. They suggested that if I like it go and train and I was like how? Go on the internet, so that led me to training which took 3 years. It is not easy and it is a hell lot of money. We're talking twenty to thirty thousand pounds. So the period of three years I worked like this- you do your first 3 modalities to get personal clearing, and then wait for the next 6 months as next program will be in Bulgaria or whatever and they do it intentionally like that, and then along the road you can check that out it gets ridiculous. And it's like and say I no longer want to do this anymore, this is crazy, anyway I managed to stick with it, and I was certified in 2015, so it was not meant for me to become a Trainer but to accomplish what I started because it was a difficult thing for me. I was a difficult student I never completed things even a book, so I told myself I want to see this to an end, so after certifying I had to do like 200 people as part of thesis, so I came back to Botswana and I grabbed people from streets 'like come and breath come and breath,' it brought huge change and I heard people saying "wow this stuff is great," so one thing led to one another from five years ago. Ok, I went back to England and I continued getting paid for it because that part of certification. You had to do 200 hours free hours, then you have to do 600 paid hours where you document everything and send back to the head office. It's very difficult by the way. It's a lot easier now, it was quite difficult back then.

So, I had to ask for money which was really strange and scary. I came from Botswana with a good stance.

I had a saving grace...I looked good when I came. And people said like, 'this is a lady from Botswana lets breath with her.' Mostly there were white people attending and they kind of looked at me and they thought maybe she knows a little more and I think that's what attracted a lot of people to me. They realized I've got grey hair. In 2017 it was very shocking because I was told literally that my mother passed away, and she was gone a week before I got there. I was shocked as I had never seen anyone die that was when I was doing my metaphysics. In metaphysics they'd say she's dead. And that blew my mind. Metaphysics is an amazing topic, it's very weird and that's how they talk. So, I was certified in 2016 as a Bachelor of Science in

Metaphysics-which is amazing and really helpful how it put these things altogether, that's when I became a vegan at the time... nor more eating animals and no more eating anything that walked or made a sound. So, 2018 I decided to come back to Botswana, it was never in my father's interest to come back to Botswana. It was like there's nothing for you here and you should never come back and it was like I want to come back; I don't care if there's nothing for me. Because, I had to live in London and I know I didn't have everything I needed, because I managed to live in London because I had so much access to stuff. I didn't feel scared to come here, you know I served Margaret Thatcher Clothing, I've met Evona Trump so coming back to Botswana it didn't scare me to live that link. I knew when I came here, I will go higher and there's going to be more for me and I don't know what is going to be 'that more' for me. So, since 2018 doing this four times I've done a lot of people in this country the results are there. You'll be surprised who rocks at my door



I believe as professionals we have an obligation to educate our customers on consumerbuying behaviour, so that they can use their monies wisely."

According to you, what's your favourite part about being a fashion designer?

"It gives you opportunity to step outside of your comfort zone, and if you're the kind of person who enjoys a challenge treading an unknown path; or requires a certain amount of pressure in order for your performance to show-up and excel- the fashion industry provides the ideal environment for you to thrive. With trends rotating and fading in and out of fashion, the industry is ever changing. Hence, as part of your readiness plan in this industry, you need to be prepared for that constant change. That's why I decided to choose fashion."

Who are your biggest inspirations? My coaches. How did you feel after knocking out an opponent and being the first Motswana to win the Title?

After winning this fight I was so happy and it gave me courage to keep pushing hard in Boxing. I am the first Motswana to win this it feels great.

Your career seems back on track. Who is your trusted adviser? My coaches.

What do you want to be remembered for at the end of your career?

I want to be remembered by this WBF champion Tittle when my career ends

and other wins that are yet to come in future.

If you could have one dream fight with anyone, who would it be?

I am one person who believes in me, I could fight any boxer in and outside the country.

What is the biggest challenge did you encounter during preparations for the WBF Title Fight? One challenge I passed through was that; sometimes I struggle with money for transport to and from the gym, I also had challenges with money to do medicals. It will be great if some company can come on board and sponsor me.

What impact does the win has in your life? Any last words?

My last words, "is that it is still early to tell about the impact it has; I want to thank God for giving me a strength in every step of the way to my win. Secondly, I want to thank everyone who has been there for me, family and friends."



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
