makuvuki BW is a local music group comprises of four men, who are based in Lobatse. It was formed in 2010 while they were still at Itireleng Juniour

School and it was signed in the Executive media. The group is based in United States and Botswana.

Tell us about your new album and its genre.

We have an album called Monateng EP volume 1, it was dropped last year on November 27th and it's an Afro-house music. It's our first album, but we have singles released before; Digital, Monate wa Itirelwa, Vava-Vom, Botswana, Matombezana and

Jwale.

How is the album doing in the market so far?

Ever since its release, I can't say the album is doing well, but through social media platforms so far our album tops chats in the United States as it stands at number 96. In Africa we are the only artist after Master KG that are in the top 100 of iTunes - United States.

Having said that about the album, what does this mean to you as Amakuvuki?

I'd say I believe that the album will take us somewhere, it will sell us because ever since it was released people have received it in a massive and impressing number and this means a lot to us. But one thing that disappoints is that Batswana lack support on local music and we've seen it with this album because we ended up giving away CDs which were meant to be sold to them.

Do you classify yourselves as well established or upcoming artists?

We are not upcoming artists because we have so many years in the music industry and we would classify ourselves as well experienced and established artists. We have 11 years in the industry, so Batswana should know that we have been there, we are not upcoming artists and at this time Batswana should be knowing that there is a group called Amakuvuki.

How much has Corona affected you?

We never wanted Corona to have any impact on our music because we been pushing our music since it started and we didn't want it to hinder our music production in any way. We have so many ways to push ourselves with, like selling our merchandise and music through social media platforms. Corona-19 has affected the music industry because events have been cancelled since it started.

You are working as a group, may you please enlighten us on your background? We used to be seven in the group since we started music, and others left because they felt the toughness in the industry. Working as

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MIMIE BRINGS OUT HER Dream to reality

he started to develop a fond in music at a tender age and joined the Sunday school praise and worship team back then where she would present musical items at Church whenever there's a special occasion, glorifying the Almighty with her voice.

Time passed, she went to junior school where she joined an acapella group led by Mr Mosweu and they performed whenever there was a special event in Jwaneng.

> According to Amantle Michellin Moumakwa aka Mimie, at her home no one believed that indeed she was gifted. Taking it back to the days she said, "I remember leading this other song at the June 16 event (Day of the African Child) when we were at the multipurpose hall in Jwaneng. My mom was part of the crowd and she was shocked to see me, you know Batswana 'Mmagwe ngwana yo o kae a sa letse mogolokwane'...hahaha". She said at senior school she was so obsessed with singing so she joined the School Choir and mind you, by that time she was part of the youth praise team at Church. In 2018 Mimie went to the University of Botswana to do Computing with Finance but the inner part of her wanted to study music. Her senior school colleagues who also liked music and used to do acapella with her like; Jazzlyn Tiah, Thorne David Tlhabiwe, and Ntlame entered the music world she wanted to and did the same but she hesitated as her parents wouldn't allow it. When she was in the second year, Jazzlyn Tiah asked her for a collabo, he gave her a beat and she wrote the song "Colour Box" he scheduled the recording session with Dada Kavino and upon hearing that the song they recorded wasn't bad. She made her mind that she is becoming an artist. She didn't tell her parents and in March 2020 Mimie released her first single titled "O ile". Her music is an Afro-pop genre.

Responding on the question about how Covid affected his music career, Mimie said

she dropped her first single on March 13th, last year and a few days after that came the national lockdown, strictly no movement as the industry was shut down and she couldn't even promote her song enough. She couldn't go to radio stations and she was just a beginner who didn't know what to do with the song. It worsened the matters because she couldn't meet people who were willing to help her with things that concerned her music. She also said she had a few songs that were ready so she just released haphazardly without a plan more so that she didn't have a manager. Therefore she never got the chance to benefit financially from her projects. Mimie got booked for a show on December at Molepolole and it was cancelled a week before its actual date because of the curfew.

When describing her development ever since she joined the music industry, Mimie said, "I'm growing, for a person who just started music last year with all the challenges of Covid-19 I would say I'm developing and its promising that surely they'll be a spark at the end of the tunnel more so that now people are approaching me wanting collaborations, and some wanting to manage me, so its promising".

She added by saying what she enjoys about being a musician is that she pours out her heart in songs, she gets to be creative as she writes, and that on its own is fun. Mimie also said she interacts with people here and there, travels to shoot videos and for an adventurous person like her, being a musician is fun. But she hates the judgement that she gets from friends and family members.

She mentioned that in most cases people associate artists with all the immoral acts, so once you become an artist you face a lot of criticism "Batho ba simolla go batla gore o tshele jaaka bone ba batla, ha nne o tshwana le Mimie o tsena kereke ba simolla go feel gore you are a hypocrite kind of..."

Comparing the local music industry with that of other countries, she said music industry in Botswana is poor, not because we're lacking talent just that it seems like people don't see music as something that can boost the economy.

Advice to the aspiring musicians, "I would say follow your heart and take risks for what you love, don't wait to do what you love until it's late".



Where your money buys more





rom nowhere, we came to know about two things this past month, number one is a village in the Okavango area called SERONGA. We secondly also came to know of a young artist who hails from that very village called KOOLKAT all because of a song that went

viral on the social media platforms common to Batswana like Facebook and Tiktok named "Ko Seronga."The song that has been playing on everyone's head was introduced to us just by a simple Facebook vine made by a local comedian but went on viral with endless challenges made on Facebook and Tiktok. The 25 year old said he made the song when he was feeling home sick and he would have not figured that he would be where he is now, so we got to have a chat with him about the song;

So tell me about yourself and your background generally?

KoolKat is a young man who was born in Seronga, then relocated to Maun because of family reasons around 2003/4, I grew up mostly in Maun. I grew up with the love for music and I loved recording music but never really took it out there officially, the first time I did try to do that was in 2017 when I did a theme song for the Tlatsa Lebala movement which got famous around the college where I was schooling, but I didn't take it further until now.

Regarding being a musician, how long have you been doing that and is this something you came across or grew up with the passion for?

Just growing up I have always loved music, I would sing along to all the famous songs and cram the lyrics and would listen to a song till it ended. I started doing music when I was in Form 2, I had a cousin of mine called Lesedi Timane, he is the one who called me that KoolKat name. We called each by the name until I took it up officially. We would write lyrics and record on our phones for fun until we went on to record at studios up until I went to college where I would record songs on my laptop and share to friends. In 2017 when Tlatsa Lebala went famous at school, it got me to certain places and I got nominated to be Minister of Entertainment but after that I never really got anywhere I just kept on at the same pace being comfortable with that until "Ko Seronga."

You actually caught the limelight with the Ko Seronga song, people now came to know who you are, and so what is the

song about, like when you released, what was the story behind it?

I did the Seronga song because I was missing home, I have been in the city for quite a long time so I just wrote it, if you listen the song you will notice that there are names mentioned in it and those are the names of my aunts, uncles and friends you know family members. It was also just about the games and activities we used to do in Seronga back then before this internet era where we would spend time together you know, so it was just about those times and the song gives one that feeling and the longing that even someone who has actually never been there can still relate to. So it also not just about the song now but selling our country, selling Seronga as a tourist place since the song trended and brought that curiosity among people about the place.

What actually made the song to become so popular and trend among social media platforms like Facebook and even Tiktok as well?

Well there is this young man called Poloko, he has a page on FB and he is a comedian makes funny videos on facebook so he made a video dancing to the song and it caught the attention of people on social media and it was watched shared all over and went to over 20 000 views and the challenge started there. After all the attention I took up the opportunity to open a page and made sure the attention was on the page too.

Is it the only song that you have officially released?

Officially yes it is my first officially dropped song and registered etc., but I have a lot of songs like I said before the Tlatsa Lebala one.

So talking about the song can you say it's the one that has bought you the spot as a known local artist like in the local music world?

Well I guess what Tlatsa Lebala did was to make me known but only to a small crowd whom one can say expected me to one day be somewhere as a musician but the limelight and relevance came through this song and I was ready to do something about it so it's different now.

Now that you are here you have released this hit it's blowing, what are your other plans, are you maybe working on an official video release and possibly any other projects?

Yah, we are working on such but we want to take things step by step, and a video is in the plans and we are looking into going to Seronga where I want the video to be shot and i am also looking for a team to work with, all of that. With projects, we are introducing a new genre called "Motyiko" which comes from the word go tyika a Setawana word we like to use so Motyiko is just the usage of Setawana on a song. The major keys are just Afro-pop and Kwasa beats and lyrically in Setawana. The aim is not to end with Seronga and go back to the foreign genres like Amapiano and all, not that we wouldn't completely not work with those at times but to have our own unique sound that sells out there and identifies us in the Northwest and work with young artists coming from that side.

Still talking about the future plans, are you planning any collaborations with some of these renounced artists like Vee Mampeezy or Charma Gal or maybe LaTimmv?

Like I said my intension is to build a genre but one day I do not mind to feature these artists, that is not our intention right now, it is to build that North-western music and obviously where we need help for instance LaTimmy if he can be able to work with us in a particular project that he may fit into, we will be really looking to work with everyone just to promote our country.





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So has no one of these famous artists approached you yet when the song went viral to maybe work with you? Well the buzz started, but LaTimmy because he is a good guy and all he called just to give out some advice and looking out for me and telling me to be on the lookout for some things you know with all the buzz the song has been through. Um really glad he did that.

So building your brand now as a known artist, what are the challenges you have been encountering?


Some of the challenges have to do with the monitoring of the song's distributions you know having to have Batswana have the song but still also making sure to earn from its distribution. It's not easy for all that having the challenge of the Covid-19 and another challenge is having to adapt to being this kind of artist now who has to deal with dropping other projects and dealing with those issues wisely you know, the challenges are a lot but God helps me through every decision I make and gives me the wisdom to deal with all that.

So since we are in time like this with ristrictions to many things due to the Covid-19 like concerts and bookings how have you been trying to make an earning from the song?

Like I said we are still strategizing with my team, so I have tried to market the song in a way that will be monitored in platforms like iTunes where people will obviously have to go buy it as it already known it has been in the trend and well marketed even outside the country. We are also working on a way to have it sold in Botswana to people without access to such platforms too.

So to wrap it up what can you say as a young artist who is also upcoming, what is it that you can share with everyone out there and fellow upcoming artists too?

What I can say to fellow artists is that you have to know why you are doing music, once you know, you will be able to make music that gets you paid, when you know the reason you can be able to identify yourself as a musician and have your unique selling sound. And I can also say we have the support of Batswana so our content should appeal to them as our customer and as artists we are the ones to help Batswana grow that mentality of support because we are the ones who hold that power to inspire them as artists. Lastly, I can say always trust God, he will always guide and inspire you in all you do.

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Meet The Optimistic Business Minded Young Lady



he is currently studying Bachelor of Science in Real Estate, a first year student at the University of Botswana. She is a model and the National Director\ Founder of Miss Teen Africa Botswana and also the owner of Lame's Modelling Academy. Her name is Lame Leungo Jerry, born and raised in a small village called Maitengwe. She is a 19 year old very enthusiastic and business minded young lady who believes in hard work.

Lame started Miss Teen Africa Botswana when she was doing form 5. Immediately when she finished form 5, she started operating it, she opened a page for Miss Teen Africa Botswana and to her surprise people started liking it. According to her, it was not easy at first and it's still not easy because sponsors in Botswana are scarce. So, Lame wrote letters and proposals to different companies (government and private) but had no luck and she also went to the BNYC to ask for sponsorship but unfortunately, she got rejected because they wanted her pageant to have at least two years or more experience in the industry, nonetheless, she never gave up though. In 2019 she hosted auditions and only three people showed up, at that moment she had paid for the venue but as time went by some people started showing interest and started registering and she ended up having ten contestants. In 2020, Lame was supposed to host the first ever Miss Teen Africa Botswana but they were hit by the Pandemic and the government declared lockdown in the country and then she postponed the event to 2021. According to Lame, this year she did the auditions online and over 60 girls registered and auditioned, now they have a coronation ceremony which will be on the 1st of May at Cresta President Hotel where they will be crowning the first ever Miss Teen Africa Botswana. Since she doesn't have sponsors, she has been saving her school allowance so that she can prepare for the Grand Finale. In a nut shell, Lame's journey was not a good one but she has learned to be patient in life and that not everything comes easy because one has to work really hard for everything to turn out great.

When she grew up, Lame loved pageants and modelling, she said that she used to watch Miss Botswana when she was young and would picture myself walking on the stage. Her passion for modelling and pageants grew as with time. When she was at pre-school on her graduation day, she joined the pageant at school and they were all given prizes. That was the best experience she ever had. She went on to her junior school and there was a pageant called Miss Parwe CJSS which she wanted to join but she was scared and not ready, although she ended up being the Master of Ceremony for the pageant. Lame said when she was doing form 4, her passion for modelling started kicking in so deep and she joined Miss Ledumang unfortunately she only scooped the title of Best Dress. She said she was a little disappointed but as she is, she doesn't spend time crying for her losses, instead she finds ways to correct that and do better next time. "....without determination you will never start and without consistency you will never finish, I MOVE and now I am a freelance model. I advertise clothes and I am also a brand ambassador," she added.

esides being an organizer of Miss Teen Africa Botswana, Lame is also the founder of Lame's Modelling Academy, she trains aspiring models and those that want to do better in the modelling industry. She also helps them to learn the ropes and acquire skills needed to become a successful and professional model, and to boost their confidence in general. According to her, "Modelling is such a competitive industry so learning the basics puts you at the top of the pile when it comes to booking jobs. Modelling is a highly vocational business. There is more to modelling than just a quirk poses or walk, luckily in my academy we cover everything from pose to pose, portfolios to personal care." Lame is also working on a project which involves charity and giving called Lame Foundation. She helps the needy people together with her team. They make donations to families and children who are in need. The Project has not been launched yet but it is expected to be launched very soon. Like she said on her introduction, Lame is a full time first year student at the university of Botswana, studying Real Estate.

When asked if she is in a relationship, Lame replied, "Yes, I am in a relationship with my best friend Khumo Pheko. 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The Attractiveness Of Mokolodi Nature Reserve

okolodi Wildlife Foundation led to the establishment of the Mokolodi Nature Reserve in 1994. It is now home to a variety of animals and vegetation that are found in the south-eastern part of Botswana.

The Reserve programmes have grown significantly since its formation, giving a good track to its mission. Mokolodi as a nature reserve, carries abundant activities to protect life of animals. One of the most prominent conservation projects undertaken by Mokolodi is the white rhino-breeding programmes. It also has a wildlife sanctuary that supports sick or injured wildlife that are often rescued by members of the public.

Mokolodi works on occasion with other local conservation NGOs, such as Birdlife Botswana, Cheetah Conservation Botswana and Leopard Ecology & amp Conservation, focusing on specific activities that improves the country's conservation and education efforts.

In case of sustainability and conservation, Mokolodi nature reserve offers fee-based tourism activities like game drives, rhino tracking and conferencing, as well as great accommodation. The income generated from these activities assist the Reserve in subsidising its conservation and education programmes, while providing treasured experiences to Reserve visitors.

Giving an inclusive economic eye view, Mokolodi Nature Reserve employs approximately 100 people, of which approximately 75 are from neighbouring communities.

- Melt the butter in a large, oven safe, saucepan over medium heat until it foams and starts to brown a little
- Add the garlic and cook until fragrant, about 30 seconds.
- Sprinkle in the flour and cook until it starts to brown a little, about a minute.
- Add the milk and cook until it thickens, about 2 minutes.
- Mix in the nutmeg, salt and pepper.
- Add the parmesan and mozzarella and cook until it melts into the sauce.
- Mix in the spinach, feta, dill, parsley, green onions.
- Mix in the tortellini, sprinkle on the mozzarella and bake in a preheated 350F/180C oven until the cheese has melted and the sides are bubbling, about 15 minutes.

THE IMMEASURABLY FINE ARTIST

h a b a n g Koogotsitse first discovered his talent at the age of five and according to him, he didn't think much of it back then. He started by

drawing a simple bus and got paid P20. For a while, he wanted more P20 notes to keep coming but it never happened. As time went on, Thabang then went to primary school where he met other students who could draw but they couldn't do it as good as him and that meant a lot to him because he liked the status of being "the best" and he supposes that's how his talent grew. He went through his school years being told he's the best though he wasn't getting paid for it.

He said that in 2016, when he was still a tourism student at ABM University he made a drawing of his friend called Oreneile Mlambo who got so impressed and even asked him to open an art page on Facebook to market his work and that's how Dodo's Art came to be.

Growing the page audience was the most difficult part for Thabang as he wanted to give up more often than not because he couldn't sell any of his work for a while but eventually he started selling one artwork here and there which was helping his student allowance to cover all my bills, that's when art turned from being something he does for fun to something he does for a living.

He then made an artwork for Khumo Kgwaadira which shocked people because of how amazing it was. Thabang said a lot of people said it was done with a computer app and it got so much attention that it hit over 30k likes and that's when he started getting a lot of clients. "One thing I learnt with art is that you don't have to approach customers, you have to create an artwork at your level best and customers will approach you and when they do, give them your level best again and their friends will know about you. That's my selling strategy, I get people to talk about my work," said Thabang.

As good as he's with art, he's not only focused on it, but he is also focused on agriculture. He breeds chickens and manufacture egg incubators. Back to art, Thabang has sold a lot of artworks and has even lost count. He sells his artworks to people of different backgrounds and he even has some of his work in India and America.

He has never really cared about entering art competitions because he feels growing artists should be given a chance to win and has something that motivates them. "I remember a few years back I got removed from an art competition because I was on a different level so there was no point of me competing when the results are obvious," he added.

Thabang does fine artists and he draws using graphite pencil, black charcoal and white charcoal pencils, tombow mono eraser, electrical eraser, and a blender. His business name is Dodo's Art and it can be found on Facebook & Instagram. He said that he never draws unless he's getting paid for it.

He advised the aspiring artists by saying, "I just want young artists to be confident about their work and they should respect their work, if a customer can't afford their work then the artwork can find a cheaper artist. Also, invest on the most expensive art materials you can find, that's how you can produce high quality work. Draw at your level best and your work will speak for you, customers will approach you."

Lie down on your back, bend your knees and place your arms along each side of your body. Exhale through pursed lips as you contract the abdominals and lift your pelvis. Inhale through the nose and hold the position. Exhale to lower your pelvis back to the ground and repeat the exercise.

Hand stretch

It's good for people with pain in their fingers and hands. Spread your fingers as wide as they can go, then make a fist, and repeat that stretching and squeezing motion. 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NBA great Michael Jordan will present Kobe Bryant for basketball Hall of Fame induction


Jordan described Bryant as a little brother in an emotional speech at his memorial service at the Staples Center, where Bryant made so many highlights during his 20-year career.

"When Kobe Bryant died, a piece of me died, and as I look at this arena and across the globe, a piece of you died," he said last February. "I promise you, from this day forward, I will live with the memories of knowing that I had a little brother that I tried to help in every way I could. Please rest in peace, little brother."

The enshrinement ceremony for Bryant and the Hall of Fame Class of 2020, which includes players Tim Duncan, Kevin Garnett and 10time WNBA All-Star Tamika Catchings, was delayed because of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Jordan also will present Baylor coach Kim Mulkey, who led her team to three NCAA national championships and is the only person to ever win championships as a player, assistant coach and a head coach.

The ceremony will also honor coaches Rudy Tomjanovich, Barbara Stevens and Eddie Sutton, who died in May, and Swiss basketball executive Patrick Baumann, who died in 2018. Source:net



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












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
