



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

e is a gentleman of Kanye village, a rapper, producer and a film director who graduated in the streets. He started doing music in 2016 after finishing his Cambridge at Kgari Sechele Senior

Secondary School in Molepolole.

Thatayaone Mphetlhe was introduced to music by Dada Kavino after he discovered his music talent and passion. That's when he started recording his music in 2016.

For the love of music, Bless ManTee – as he is affectionately known, wanted to explore more and learn new things like producing music so every time he would go to Dada Kavino's studio to learn one or two things.

He said that sometimes he would ask him questions about the things he doesn't understand when making beats and when he gets home he would practice the beats in his computer. "I learnt other stuff from the internet. In 2017 I started learning how to direct a shoot, how to do photoshoot and edit videos, thanks to Bantu Frames for playing a role in my life," so he said. Bless ManTee said in 2019 he worked with Jaah Breed Wametlae, he is a comedian with over 10012k followers. He started working with him when he had about 6000k followers - the time when he started directing, shooting and editing Landlord facebook series from landlord Part 1 to Part 35 and parted with them when they had around 10009k followers in 2020 to focus on his music career.

Bless ManTee said this year in August, he released his first single that he composed from his very own Studio titled 'Daily Basis' in which he features Tesy J. He also said right now he is working on his first album titled 'Real Life 1' in which he is talking about his life.

He thanks his family and fans for their support and said he will forever be grateful for that.

eet Panashe Nyatoro well known as Antido.te. He is a producer, artist, songwriter & fashion designer who does hip-hop/trap and well other genres like alternative music, RnB and experimental music based in Mogoditshane. He started doing music in 2013 when he was still in a form 1 student and later got into the Botswana music Industry in early 2017 with a hip-hop group well known as Drippy Klan.

In his years of music Panashe has worked with quiet a number of artists locally namely, Drippy Kin who is his young brother, Taeylor, YB Picasso, Gappy Roberts, Teddy West, Yung Amazeing & Legacy (Khiring Khiring Khorong Hit makers),QVO and Ammoskimask now known as Balaclava Blanco only to mention a few. He also has collaborations from international producers in USA & Canada who have worked with mainstream artists in USA - the likes of Mesodrip (worked with


Mexikodro ,Playboi Carti, Rich The Kid & a lot more) Some of the songs are going to be in his upcoming tape with his partner, Taeylor. Panashe produced a soundtrack for an American documentary, "Blindfolded! That was shot in Botswana & South Africa. It simply focuses on the beauty of Africa and how Africa is not way too different from other parts of the world. Through his journey of music he has achieved a lot with his group and also individually. He made 100 000 plays on SoundCloud in the first year of dropping music and became the second verified artists in Botswana and SoundCloud. He has performed at few events namely Winter Shutdown, Explosion Summer Bash & Molepolole Makgasa Party. They have given back to Ledumang High School by organizing a talent show in 2019 and performed there. They also donated money to the school without getting any percentage from it.

Panashe has worked on street wear fashion in supplement of his music journey. He owns a clothing line by the name, "Dripped" which has been running since 2019. In his street wear fashion journey he has worked with Balaclava Blanco and an Instagram influencer by the name Katie with over 12K followers. Still he has more collaborations under fashion with a Philippine Streetwear brand by the name Troupe.His music played in different countries and mostly the streams were from America since he has had radio plays from Radio stations in Miami & Atlanta and clubs in Canada.

He is currently dropping an upcoming mixtape by the name Purple Fantasy with his colleague Taeylor which has 20 tracks featuring local artists and international features from South Africa, Canada and USA. In the long process Panashe has worked on a 60 track album that is purely sounding international and is scheduled to drop next year with a documentary series.

According to him, this 60 track album is intended to break the world record of the highest number in a digital album by a duo in Africa. Having to believe in hard work, he has dropped more music on digital platforms that can amount to more than 80 tracks. He has more future collaborations that are on the way with more international artists and local artists.

e is a young producer and RnB singer who has so much passion for the genre. Alil Boy, born Elliot Basupang is a selfmotivated artist who owns a record label titled DARK 9T RECORDS. The Thamaga native who is 25 years says he has been in the industry for 10 years now as a singer and producer He

10 years now as a singer and producer. He recently chatted with CW and this is what he had to say:

Tell us about yourself

I am a music producer and a singer under my

record label called DARK 9T RECORDS. I am a courageous artist who works with motives and an aim of achieving self-targeted goals as a result of success. I believe that it does not matter how slowly it goes as long as I don't stop.

What inspired you into taking up the arts? Listening to good music motivated me to get involved in the game, but in a different way using my mother and father tongue (Setswana) and English to compose with a flava. For how long have you been in this industry?

I have been in the game for about 10 years now.

Since joining the industry how many released songs have you got on your portfolio?

I have more than 15 songs.

Have things been working according to your expectations so far t?

Things have been working so fine except that Covid-19 affected my work and I failed to put food on my table.

It must be quite a challenge trying to become an established artist in the industry, how do you work about tackling those challenges?

It's a quite challenge yes, am trying by all means to put a head where it's open to show up. Taking my CDs to radio stations so that my music can be known. My manager Pixel Tshegisi also known as Pixel promotions helps me in growing by finding gigs for me.

Your profile states that your song "My Everything" is a love song, and you base yourself with Rnb, WHY?

RnB is my life. I love music that talks 'MY EVERYTHING' song was composed because I wanted to show my girl that she's my everything.

Do you only do RnB music or you also have experimented with other genres?

I also do other genres like house music. I have mojolo song kind of Makhadzi style and it's a hit.

How did your song get reception?

People really enjoy my music because they get the message from it and it is highly received by Batswana.

How did you come about to work on it with a South African artist?

I was connected with my manager Pixel promotions to work with her, and I would like to work with King Monada in one of the good days and I trust that it will happen soon.

What are you working on the moment? I am working on a single called Re Happy.

Is there anybody you are collaborating with?

I am working on a collaboration with Flexyville and Ricki Renei at the moment.



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The Sensational Entertainer Julian Lock Ken

In this world there are those born with a silver spoon, with the lime light upon them from day one and then there are those that work hard to earn their spots, for some it may even take years to gain them. Well, that has not been the case with our very own multitalented and internationally renounced Comedian and Musician, William Last KRM. He may have not been born to the spotlight but he was made for it. While it takes many years to get to work for, for him it only took a few vines and today he is the talk of local talent.

Born Bofelo William Molebatsi, the comedian/musician has three other siblings and one is a soccer player for the biggest local football team, Township Rollers. The soccer player, Thalefo Molebatsi is one of the people that the musician looks up to. William Last KRM, of course shot to fame as the wellknown Motsetserepa, we all enjoyed to watch as he made us laugh our lungs out, but the entertainer, which he likes to refer himself to, was more into music even before doing comedy. Although we never really at first knew of it when we all came to know about him, he did start off as a musician. He has been doing comedy since 2017, but as for music he did it and had the love for it from as far as his school days. He says that when he was in standard 3 he would write songs even for people to sing to.

When talking about how he came to take up comedy, he said that it was never for fame and to make some living out of it. The singer also said that it was more of a passing time hobby as he barely had nothing to do having been unable to perform well at his BGCSE. Although he never really thought to see himself where he is today passing time with vines, he actually has a background with acting as he did it back at school during his school time. He even got to have awards for being a good actor as well. Fast forward as destiny would have it doing comedy although it never was intended to make him an earning and he realised that it was something that could actually get him putting food on the table. He went on to say that at times things just happen unexpectedly, that God sometimes leads us to where we never imaged and is part of the journey. From the moment he started it all he did was to come up with some money especially when he did stand-up comedy. Eventually he was also making money from making advert vines as well.

Being a musician has always been part of him, the love goes way back to those school days but taking it serious and becoming an artist, that came to light only in 2018. In 2018 he released his first project, the Bofelo E.P. He says that however the project never really went on to do well as he would have expected it to as not many people knew about it apart from the song with Mpho Sebina. But of course that did not make him stop or demoralize him, rather he kept working on music. Come 2020, his time had finally arrived to shine. He released an album titled AMARA that finally not only caught the local attention but also the international attention as well. The album was a way for him to share with people about his reality, behind the comics, the laughs from comedy, he wanted to communicate his pain and have us understand that he too like everyone was human and has as much problems as anyone else. He has gone to also become top of the list for the sort after collaborations. He even got to be featured by the likes of big names like South Africa's Boity on her O18 Finest remix and a local best upcoming group Ubuntu Band.

Motsetserepa recently released another single, Aah that reminds one of the Aah that was released back in the day by kwaito legend Mapetla. The song is more like a remake rap version of the Mapetla song. When asked about it being a tribute to Mapetla, he said it was a little intended to that, but it was mostly a way of just bringing back the song's vibe in the rapped kind of way. He said that it was also just to have that "Aah" as an amazed response to what he actually was rapping about in the song, like him being a father and all.

Now, one of the opportunities or one lucky thing he would have to also think that obviously made his album Amara get the attention it deserved is the moment he got international attention after he sang to one of Chris Brown's song, "Don't wake me up." After making the video, he was lucky enough to have the singer Chris Brown see it and even commented to it and that sparked international recognition. He said he even got to gain some more followers internationally from countries like the US and in South Africa as well, he was positioned. Him making good of the opportunities, he went on to release the best albums in local music and that had many just tipping off their heads to especially one song that became an international hit and even got so many good reactions and reviews from many known international reactors especially on YouTube.

His Tinto song went on to gain so many






views and likes on YouTube and even got to surpass many big African songs as well from renounced African artists. Another his most viewed video is also one parody song from the amapiano song Akulaleki by Sasha. Apart from the Tinto song being successful, the other one that has also become a success and also got reactions from all over was "How it feels", that he featured sweet voiced Dato Saiko. The song is by far the most emotional song we got to enjoy but at the same time getting to relate to the problems that the star has been through. It actually may have been him telling his story, but when one sings to the chorus how it feels, you actually have that feeling of selfexpression as well. The song for him was just to express himself about his background and all that he had gone growing. On the day they recorded the song, a friend of him and Dato Saiko too had passed on so it went to have those expressions that really made it a very touching song.

"I wanna leave a legacy," said the star when asked about how much of an impact he want to make on local music. He also said that growing up he got inspired by local artist Scar, but not necessarily meaning that he wanted to make music the same way that Scar does. Motsetserepa said he believes that one needs to be unique and do music in their own way, but it has to be the best of them. He went on to say that he wants people to talk about him even when he was gone and even have to be a study in the education system one day. He went on to indicate that even one day his daughter could be proud to have him as a father. He said that he wanted to show everyone, even someone with a disability that nothing is impossible, it's about having that mentality of I can do it no matter where I come from.

As he continued talking local about talent. music and comedy Motsetserepa went on to say that Botswana has a lot of talent and is even better than many countries in comedy and music. He said that the talent available is good enough to have an impact on the economy of the country because it does move things in Botswana. "There is so much talent that can actually get us somewhere it's just that people at times do not know how to handle





fame and they even use it for different useless things. Some young talents even get used up in the industry and have their worth undermined or taken advantage of, If things were done right the industry would be huge," so he said.

The inspiring family man said that if there is one thing that is difficult it would be balancing family and business times. He said he understands that nothing is more important than family and love. He also said nothing can ever buy that saying and he has finally come to master to that ability to work around it, balancing his work and being the family man we all know him to be. He went on to say that at times one gets too drawn to money which is really bad, as much as of course everyone needs money.

On the issue of any project he has in the pipeline, he said that they were currently working on a huge project which is an album that he says they are still taking their time to work on because they want it to be even bigger and better than the last one. Motsetserepa also said he will keep making more vines. He went on to say that he has grown to a place that he is happy with, but said he would like to see himself having grown even in terms of personality as well and finally he is very grateful of the support he gets from everyone at large.

ncounter one of the confident youths in Botswana who made it to the fashion industry and are hopeful for the future. Panashe Nyatoro is the face behind Dripped Worldwide, which was

established in 2019 as a streetwear fashion brand & entertainment company. His main focus was to express emotions and feelings he went through streetwear fashion since fashion has been a biggest factor to the hiphop industry. Panashe said in the interview that his biggest influence was his mom, who is a fashion designer and in every piece she put together was really perfect. He also said that he would admire every piece and wish one day to be putting together the biggest fashion pieces in Botswana and the world.


According to him, as a kid growing up they didn't have much, they couldn't afford fancy and glamorous clothing from the world's biggest brands in the world which made him feel outdated and so backwards but as time went on he started his own clothing line so that he could put his own authenticity and originality in the fashion he wore. He has designed prints on t-shirts from his own phone since he didn't have enough equipment to use and till now all the designs he has were done on his phone. Panashe taught himself how to design through watching YouTube videos, spending time on Pinterest and learning from other streetwear brands. He added that in the process he would draw out ideas of other pieces like Cargo pants and then work with his parents in putting the pieces together.

He said growing up and seeing less of our creatives in Africa, mainly Botswana suffer and not succeed in their businesses has always been one of his biggest fuels in producing quality stuff for the locals and the international market. Therefore he wanted to inspire everyone who will come behind him that if you believe in yourself and study the market you have ventured in, you will always do wonders. He has always strived to bring mind blowing designs that are unique and authentic enough to penetrate the international street wear market and put Botswana on the Atlas.

Being the man behind the motive and also with his partners who helped co-found this legacy, Panashe has Kindreds Nyatoro, Kyle Bunhu and Greneel Nyatoro who are his siblings and who helped him in bringing up this empire. Quizzed on how the business is doing, Panashe said during the days before Corona, the business was doing well because events such as Chillstep, festivals and gatherings influenced the youth to invest in streetwear brands as they always wanted to look more different in them and also supporting local brands when they went for these events. He said now that there are so many restrictions and the economy of the country is also constantly falling, it's hard for these young people to add on most of the local streetwear brands to their carts nonetheless he believes besides fall in sales, Dripped itself has managed to rise above the struggles as he always struggled for perfection and outdoing the designs he has put before.

Asked on who helped him with the sponsorship of his business when it started, Panashe replied by saying "It is Juse Morgan, my best friend who I have never met physically but connected through Instagram, is in America. He loved my music so much he always wanted to help in anything I do as he believed I was very talented to be seen by the world. He sent me money as soon as I told her that it was a struggle to fund my music and also find capital to start my streetwear business."





e said the uniqueness and authenticity in his designs differentiate him from other brands and he passionately love everything he's doing and takes his business as one of the fundamentals

to personal growth. Every design he puts out is a sentimental expression of things that influence his life and other people's life and that on its own has managed to make him always want to bring out the best quality services for his clients. Money has never been the main drive to his success but quality has always been.

His greatest achievement in the fashion business is working with different people around the world, from the corners of America, Canada, Philippines, Spain & more. "I always incorporate the few people who have supported my business from the beginning to always help me make decisions, choose prices, and also choose designs. Making people feel like they are part of my business has always been the greatest strategy I have used in building a very strong loyal customer base," so he said.


Panashe said that not having enough funds has always been a challenge to the type of business he's doing, adding that funds act like fuel to a locomotive since he's not much into profit. He said it's hard to diversify and execute more strategies that could help the business grow.

Right now Panashe is working as a Financial Advisor and Insurance Agent at Cover Link Insurance Brokers. He said the reason why he chose this job is because it teaches him how much time he needs to put in studying marketing and advertising. It also helps him to grow in the formal world and in marketing and advertising his fashion and music since it mainly deals with marketing skills.









PATIENCE PAYS OFF - SAMUEL

he financial challenges he faced while he was a self-sponsored student at the University of Arts in Pretoria did not stop him from reaching his dream of becoming an actor. The Mmadinare native, Modisaemang Samuel Koboa said he came back home from South Africa where in 2001 he started his acting career after he met a Zimbabwean friend.

He passionately worked with different people like Joel Keitumele aka Ntsoro, former Member of Parliment for Thamaga constituency Mr Mabeo and others in the production although they went through financial challenges. Samuel said thus far they shot about 10 movie and TV dramas, but only 4 were successfully produced. He was acting as Mr Robbertson (a conman and irresponsibble father) on Colours TV drama and that was in 2018, but before 2018 he played as Detective Joseph on a movie called Chief, in 2019 he did Maele (season1) as Mr Joseph a business village Chief with 3 wives and 12 children and played Mr Palai, a loving husband to his business woman on Pillars (season 2 and 3). Colours Drama played for about six months with 26 episodes on Botswana Television and was bought by Moja on DSTV. Pillars played on Now TV from season 1 to season 3, it was 13 episodes, and it also played on Upic TV as well. As that is not enough Modisaemang is currently featuring on another 2 TV dramas The Card Holders season 1&2 and THE STAR season 2 which are still being shot in Thamaga and Gaborone respectively.

To him, building a brand is very important although it is not easy. His thought is that, a lot of money should be injected in the arts industry because it is needed to fulfill all that is needed in the production. He said although he is encountering all the hardship, he's not taken aback because acting is his passion. Through the hardship that he experienced, the versatile Modisaemang has been working hard on his talent, he has about three scripts on the table because he is a script writer as well and they consist of two dramas and a movie script. He said he is still looking on how to start shooting them although it is not an easy work as one may think.

As an actor, his opinion on how things should be done to get the film industry operate better in Botswana, Modisaemang suggests that the government should put a huge amount of cash into film industry so that actors can also benefit because currently only the producers are benefiting. "Actors don't benefit at all because they are paid peanuts. For instance, you'll find that about 10 actors share 250 thousand from the P1.5 million tender, this shows that actors are being exploited but only producers are benefiting a lot of money," he said.

When asked what he likes about his acting career nevertheless he mentioned that it doesn't have money, Modisaemang replied, "This is a very good interesting question but like I said, acting works for me because I am doing it with passion and since I know a lot of people, I never go for auditions but I always get connected and people always call and recommend me to do acting anywhere."

On his opinion about the impact of film industry in the economy of the country, Samuel said that Botswana has a lot of talent but only if the government can shoot up a lot of money in this industry or help the graduates to start their own productions locally and be able to employ other Batswana so that the film industry grows and help boost the country's economy. "Even private companies can help those graduates, we have a lot of talent coming from film schools like AFDA who are qualified and ready to conquer the film industry, but they don't have startup capital," he added.

It's funny that Samuel didn't have an inspiration to become an actor. Although he is an actor and scriptwriter, when he grew up he didn't like reading nor watching movies but from nowhere, he found himself in the film industry.

Modisaemang advices his fellow actors by saying, "Patience pays, at times you can be used by producers for a long time, but at the end someone will come scouting for you and your patience will pay off. Look at Sharon Seno who plays as Marang on Muvhango, see where she is right now, she has crossed the borders and doing quite well but she started off on Colours." Guess what else Modisaemang does, he keeps himself busy by buying and selling madila across Gaborone, Tlokweng and Mogoditshane. According to him the business is doing quiet good since its inception.

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f I remember well, I have come across so many films and biographies featuring prides of lions but this time I have seen with my eyes prides of lions at a the tourism place called Savuti here in Botswana. This was indeed a definitive experience to write home about. It was so amazing being there, watching and photographing the 'Savuti Boys' as I call them, drinking

water.

I will never forget that afternoon when the weather was gloomy and the male lions were lying on the grass and kept on checking their prey from the sides. Two, if not one of them stood and stretched itself and walked towards the water side, where suddenly the rest of the pride followed towards the same site. I guess that I was at the right place at the right time.

Savuti is famous for its mysterious and fascinating channel. It runs a distance of 100 kilometres from the Chobe River, through a gap in the sand ridge, to the Mababe Depression. Falling only approximately 18 meters, this channel brings water from the Chobe to Mababe, creating a small marsh where it enters the Depression.

The drive over sprawling wetland and savannahs that make up the Savuti Marsh (a 10,878 square kilometre stretch of land on the western corridor) provide a diverse portion of wilderness for the inhabitants of Chobe National Park. Savuti Marsh, an oasis that is fed by the Savuti Channel, an overflow from the Okavango Delta flood waters, teemed with life.

This area is well-known for offering remarkable game viewing prospects. During the dry season, you will see a variety of wild animals like elephants, black-backed jackal, bat-eared fox, and antelopes, just to mention

a few. A lot of wild animals tend to migrate from one area to the other as seasons change, like during summer times, species migrate to the area that offers fantastic predator viewing.

The Savuti area is mainly characterised by Camelthorn (Acacia erioloba) sandveld, Silver Terminalia (Terminalia sericea) sandveld, scrub savanna, and mopane veld. Savuti's almost desert-like landscape with a scorching sun, loose, hot sand, animals escaping the heat by clumping together in the limited available shade, and elephants lining up to get to the water supply, offer a wildlife experience you won't easily forget. Before the rainy season, the second migration of animals takes place, surely this takes place between November and April. They move in search of water and grasslands and eventually their migration is followed by a large number of predators. It's obvious that the Savuti boys are part of these predators, we talking about the Lions, which are the kings of the savannahs and on the other side we have tigers which rule the wilderness. These two cats are hunters that feeds on other wild species. Lions live in prides and they mark their pride by roaring.



The Humble Thabo

As the founder of Bafana Ba Diharepa, may you kindly tell us more about this group?

I founded the group (gospel choir) with only one aim, which is to produce recorded acapella music in a traditional Zion style. It has 12 members and is about to drop its first album very soon.

When you started your music how did you get through?

Firstly I met Tefo Phiri, a local gospel artist who then recommended my current producer at Soundhub Records. I found it suited to have a promoter, I met Gaone Selebo of Lady G Promotions after I dropped my album so that I could learn the ropes of the industry faster and speed up the distribution of my product. We went through interview sessions at radio stations, newspapers and I even saw myself on stage immediately after the album release.

You are pursuing what can be justified as one of the struggling genres in Botswana, how are you making it through in that area?

Honestly it's not easy, but I believe in myself that with God I'm going to make it one day. It requires courage, compassion, a proactive attitude and a spiritual wisdom.

Don't you ever feel like giving up?

No one in the music industry has ever achieved greatness without struggle, when challenges arise I look up to God, who grants me power & strength. Botshabelo ke ena, thuso e gaufi ke ena, tsohle tse nhlagelang tseleng ke di beela ena ka thapelo tsohle tsa loka bofelong.

What do you think needs to be done to improve gospel genre in Botswana?

In my humble opinion, I think it's very clear that the Gospel industry needs to be propelled even further. Pardon me for the lengthy reply, there are a number of relative reasons:

*It would take initially collective team effort to propel this genre even further. For illustration, look at how commercial house artists have come together and offer help to one another with some even going as far as offering free features to upcoming artists so as to engage them more and at the end pushing the industry. If those same principles or something similar can be enacted in the Gospel industry then we would go far.

*We would need high quality digital media as well as the equivalent expertise to utilise it i.e. producers. Speaking for myself most producers are not yet confident with my type of Gospel and as such leading to partially produced songs that could still use some work but if they were skilled enough with the tech behind production then producing and mastering my type of beats would not only be world class but prove to be effective and efficient as well.

*The fourth industrial revolution is upon us and with that said we lastly need lots of online promotions. The social media is taking over the world day by day and gone are the days when people sit in front of their television sets in search of entertainment. People turn to the social media for that kind of satisfaction. We need Gospel shows hosted online for people to stream and that is how we will boost our popularity as artists and that of our beloved genre.

Who do you look up to in the Gospel industry?

Well, in Botswana unfortunately there is no gospel artist who inspires me. I only look up to the late Oleseng Shuping, all the way from South Africa. The legend is gone but his music still touches many souls.

What do you want to achieve through your music?

Honestly I want to achieve many things in the industry but most importantly I want to be a successful recording artist.

He is a young upcoming gospel singer and the founder of a group called Bafana Bah Diharepa. The young artist who hails from Molaladau but grew up in Serowe is currently doing his studies in the city where he also got to take up and pursue his singing career. He went on to work on an Ep titled 'Letsogo la Morena' in 2019, recorded and mastered by Shathiso Aaron at Soundhub Records. They also went on to complete a full album project in 2020.

As a gospel singer when was your talent discovered?

I discovered my talent in 2016, when I was about to go for high school. I believe it was a calling and God knew the right time to answer it because it happened in the blink of an eye. At that time I felt a powerful deep voice just coming out of me whenever I sang. I loved gospel music so much and guess what I'm from a Christian family.

Why did you choose this genre?

Honestly there were no options to choose from, 'ne ele thato ya modimo, go hlolegile go nna ka mokgoa oo ka baka la thato ya modimo fela, a se ka boikgethelo'. I am a singer because I preach the Christian message which sends light into the darkness of people's hearts and connects them with God to heal souls. My music is just the traditional gospel and I have two years singing it.

How many songs have you managed to release? I released my first album of 8 tracks last year.





HOW TO DO A BREAST SELF-EXAM

What to do if you find a lump

arms on your hips.

Do not panic if you think you feel a lump in your breast. Most women have some lumps or lumpy areas in their breasts all the time, and most breast lumps turn out to be gentle. There are a number of possible causes of non-cancerous breast lumps, including normal hormonal changes, a benign breast condition, or an injury. Below are the five **steps to follow to do a breast self-exam:** Step 1: Start by looking at your breasts in the mirror with your shoulders straight and your Here's what you should look for:

- Breasts that are evenly shaped without visible distortion or swelling.
- Breasts that are their usual size, shape, and color.

If you see any of the following changes, check your doctor:

- A nipple that has changed position or an inverted nipple (pushed inward instead of sticking out)
- Redness, soreness, rash, or swelling
- Dimpling, puckering, or bulging of the

skin

Step 2: Now, raise your arms and look for the same changes.

Step 3: While you're at the mirror, look for any signs of fluid coming out of one or both nipples (this could be a watery, milky, or yellow fluid or blood).

Step 4: Next, feel your breasts while lying down, using your right hand to feel your left breast and then your left hand to feel your right breast. Use a firm, smooth touch with the first few finger pads of your hand, keeping the fingers flat and together. Use a circular motion, about the size of a quarter.

- Cover the entire breast from top to bottom, side to side, from your collarbone to the top of your abdomen, and from your armpit to your cleavage.
- Follow a pattern to be sure that you cover the whole breast. You can begin at the nipple, moving in larger and larger circles until you reach the outer edge of the breast. You can also move your fingers up and down vertically, in rows, as if you were mowing a lawn. This up-and-down approach seems to work best for most women. Be sure to feel all the tissue from the front to the back of your breasts: for the skin and tissue just beneath, use light pressure; use medium pressure for tissue in the middle of your breasts; use firm pressure for the deep tissue in the back. When you've reached the deep tissue, you should be able to feel down to your ribcage.
 - Step 5: Finally, feel your breasts while you are standing or sitting. Many women find that the easiest way to feel their breasts is when their skin is wet and slippery, so they like to do this step in the shower. Cover your entire breast, using the same hand movements described in step 4.

hese pink ribbon sugar cookies are cute, but I of course could have done a better job, you can probably tell that I made them in a rush. But this is not important! What's important is that these cookies were baked for a cause?

I'm pretty sure that everyone knows or has heard of a woman diagnosed with this terrible disease. Some people have even lost friends and family members in the battle with breast cancer. Others are lucky to have survived.

October is breast cancer awareness month. Spread awareness about a disease, which is impacting 5 in 30 women in the Botswana.


But keep in mind that early detection of the disease is very important. So go ahead and schedule your yearly breast exam. I try to keep things on the happy and positive side here, but I really get terrified every time I hear the word cancer.

These cookies are so easy to make. I used my go-to sugar cookie recipe and then I cut out the ribbons with a cookie cutter I got at some store at the station. I made some pretty pink royal icing and covered the cookies with it. Then I topped with some pink ribbon sprinkles from the party shop.

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Prep Time: 20 MINS Cook Time: 15 MINS Total Time: 35 MINS

Ingredients For the sugar cookies:

1 cup softened unsalted butter

- 1 cup sugar
- 1 large egg
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- ¹/₂ tsp salt Additional flour for rolling

For the Royal Icing:

8 cups powdered sugar 6 tbsp meringue powder 2 tsp vanilla extract 12 tbsp warm water

More water to thin the icing Gel food coloring in pink Pink sprinkles

Instructions For the cookies:

In the bowl of a stand mixer, fitted with paddle attachment beat butter for 3 minutes until creamy. Add sugar and vanilla and beat until incorporated. Add egg and mix until combined. In a large bowl sift flour and add baking powder and salt. Gradually add flour to wet ingredients. Mix until flour is incorporated.

Form a ball from the dough, wrap in plastic wrap and refrigerate for 2 hours or overnight.

Take out of the fridge, when ready to make the cookies. Separate dough in half, make 2 balls. Roll each half between parchment paper, until dough is ¼n inch thick. Using a ribbon shaped cookie cutter, cut out cookies. Try to cut as many as you can. You can of course re roll the dough, but every time you do, tiny air pockets may form and cookies will not be as smooth.

Preheat oven to 350 F. Transfer cookies to a baking sheet lined with silpat or parchment paper. Bake cookies for 10-11 minutes, until they are barely beginning to turn golden. Let cookies cool on baking sheet for 10 minutes, then transfer to a cooling rack to cool completely.

For The Royal Icing:

In the bowl of a stand mixer, fitted with paddle attachment mix together powdered sugar, meringue powder, vanilla and water. Beat for around 8 minutes on medium speed, until thick and shiny.

Colour icing in pink. Use gel (paste) coloring and start by adding just a little at a time.Thin icing with water to 20 minute consistency. Fill a piping bag, fitted with Wilton # 2 tip with icing, Cover cookies with royal icing. Add some sprinkles on top (7-10 per cookie) Let the icing set for at least 4 hours. Keep cookies in air-tight container at room temperature up to 10 days, or package each cookie individually.

The Oscar winners fell for each other while filming the 2005 action film Mr. & Mrs. Smith. The origination of their relationship instantly caused controversy since Pitt was married to Jennifer Aniston at the time.

Pitt and the Salt star became serious rather quickly, with her confirming her pregnancy with their first child in January 2006. He formally adopted her son Maddox and daughter Zahara in 2006, and their children took on the surname Jolie-Pitt. The couple welcomed Shiloh in May 2006. The Maleficent actress adopted son Pax in March 2007, while the actor followed suit in February 2008. Their twins, son Knox and daughter Vivienne, were born in July 2008.

Jolie and Pitt announced their engagement in April 2012. They tied the knot in France in August 2014. However, Brangelina called it guits in September 2016. The French chateau where they wed caused more problems in the divorce settlement. The exes seemed to be on good terms as of May 2020. As their legal battle continued, Jolie asked for their judge to be disqualified from overseeing their case after failing to disclose "ongoing business and professional relationships" with Pitt and his team.


As the custody battle continued, news broke that Pitt had a new

After a judge issued a temporary ruling that would allow the former couple to share custody of their kids, it was revealed that Jolie was "bitterly disappointed" by the decision and the pair fought over their joint ownership of Château Miraval, with Pitt alleging that Jolie's attempted sale of her shares cuts him out of the chance to make a profit.

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akwala, The Fastest Botswana Sprinter

saac Makwala has his name written in the history books of Botswana as one the fastest men. Born 36 years ago in the Central District of Botswana in the village called Tutume, Makwala specializes in the 400m race. He won his first gold medal at the commonwealth games in 2018 and has also won a quite number of continental titles. He has represented Botswana well at the 2016 Summer Olympics, three times at the Commonwealth Games, and five times at the World Championships in Athletics. With the Botswana 4 \times 400m relay team he has won the bronze medal at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, a silver medal at the 2017 IAAF World Relays and medals at the African Games and Championships. Isaac Makwala, who prepares himself to retire next year became the first man in the history of sports to run on his own and eventually qualified for world championships 200m finals.

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
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
