What can be said about Tswana fashion week, will it keep going and getting


The modern Tswana Fashion Week event will keep on growing and getting bigger and bigger because the industry keeps on evolving every day.

He has been with the station for one year and two months and still counting. He has also been involved in other segments of the entertainment industry having started as a rapper and later became an artist Manager, events Mc, actor, etc. His journey has been that of highs and lows. He has also been credited as Ozi F Teddy's very first manager whom he met when he was doing form 2 without even a single recorded track. Tirelo went on to work with the legendary Wizards of the desert in his management journey. Other honorary mentions are Koola, Young Amazing and Oatsdona. In the music circles he has collaborated with almost everyone from Ozi F Teddy, T. H. A.B.O, Prez Beats, Spiza and a whole lot more.

Titty has also done adverts for radio and TV for the likes of Alpha Direct Insurance, First Sun Alliance Insurance and many more. He also went on to Mc for South African artists like Oskido etc. He said he has always considered himself to be a Botswana hidden secret as he has discovered and promoted more local artists and he is in love with local industry than an average person. Titty has always looked up to DJ Sid as he believes he stands for what he believes in and believes in local industry the same as he does. According to him, DJ Sid is also a pioneer of radio and has worked with almost everyone like Titty has.

He added that radio has given him a voice that he now uses to advocate for local music with their radio station playing 98% local music of which is the highest locally. His future plans involve moving to a radio station which is in the frequency module (FM) so that he can reach all corners of the country and surely make an impact. Kgosi Mosadi Seboko




Kgosi Mosadi Seboko was born on 7 June 1950 in Ramotswa. Her name Mosadi literally means "Woman" in Setswana, and she was given the English name "Muriel". Her father, Mokgosi II, expected a boy to be his oldest child, but upon seeing his daughter, he said, "Well, it's a woman. What can I do? It's my child. "In 1969, she graduated from Moeding College. Two years later, she became the department administrator at Barclay's Bank. She ended her six-year marriage with her abusive husband in 1978.

Mosadi Seboko's brother was kgosikgolo from 1 June 1996 to 17 June 2001 when he died from an illness. Tumelo Seboko, an uncle of Mosadi, became acting kgosikgolo from 21 June 2001 to 7 January 2002. Mosadi's mother and sisters pushed her to become the next kgosikgolo during this time, which would break a history of solely male dikgosikgolo. At the time of the installation, she worked as a floor manager at Century Office Supplies in Broadhurst. Mosadi based her claim for bogosi on the "birthright equity"; since she was the first born, she should have precedence in becoming kgosikgolo.

Seboko had many critics because she was a woman. Her uncle Tumelo wanted Tsimane Mokgosi, a cousin of Mosadi, to become kgosikgolo instead, and other members of the kgotla tried to delay her installation by saying that she did not have the skills to lead the traditional leopard hunt or to engage in the "rainmaking" ritual, both of which were necessary to prove a kgosikgolo's legitimacy. Mosadi rebutted the arguments, saying that many of those traditions fell into disuse when Christianity came to Botswana

Her ascension was revolutionary in that it overthrew a tradition where women were only allowed in the kgotla (village meeting) if they were invited by a male. She assumed office on 7 January 2002 and became chairperson of the Ntlo ya Dikgosi on 28 February 2002. She was crowned on 30 August 2003. Her leadership style is unconventional compared to her male predecessors.



Prep Time: 15 Mins **Cook Time:** 35 Mins

Ingredients:

- 120 ml hot coffee
- 32 grams cocoa powder Dutch processed
- 175 grams granulated sugar
- ¼ teaspoon vanilla extract
- ½ teaspoon kosher salt
- 1 egg room temperature
- 110 grams all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda

- ½ teaspoon baking powder
- 120 ml buttermilk room temperature
- 60 ml vegetable oil
- 64 grams walnuts finely chopped

Chocolate Frosting

- 110 grams unsalted butter
- · Pinch kosher salt
- 113 grams confectioners' sugar
- 42 grams cocoa powder
- 60 ml sour cream
- 85 grams chopped dark chocolate

Instructions

Make Cake

- Preheat your oven to 350°F/175°C. Butter or grease an 8 inch square baking pan and line it with parchment paper.
- 2. In a large bowl, whisk together the sugar and egg for 1 minute.
- 3. Add the buttermilk, hot coffee, oil, vanilla and salt. Whisk until it is smooth. Add your cocoa powder and whisk again until smooth
- 4. Add the flour, baking powder, and baking soda and whisk until smooth. Fold in your chopped walnuts
- 5. Pour into your pan and tap on the counter to get rid of any bubbles. Bake for 35-45 minutes. A toothpick inserted should come out clean. Allow it to cool for 20 minutes in the pan, then lift it out and let it cool completely on a cooling rack.

Make Frosting

- Melt your chocolate in a microwave, stirring every 10 seconds so it doesn't burn.
- In your stand mixer with the paddle attachment, beat the butter and confectioners' sugar on low speed until well combined
- 3. Turn the speed to high for 2-3 minutes until light and fluffy.
- Add in your cocoa powder and beat on low, then increase the speed to medium for 1-2 minutes.
- 5. Add your sour cream, melted chocolate and salt and mix once more.
- 6. Spread over your cooled cake and decorate with walnuts.








Ethiopia is a multi-cultural and multi-ethnic country. Religion is a major influence in Ethiopian life. Nearly half the population belongs to the Ethiopian Orthodox Church but there is also large Muslim population. Others adhere to an ancient form of Judaism. The Ethiopian Orthodox Church is proud of its origins. The country embraced Christianity in the 4th century, long before Europe. The feast of the Epiphany ("Timkat") is the largest festival of the year. The Orthodox Church dominates the political, cultural, and social life of the population. It was the official religion of the imperial court and of the establishment until Haile Selassie was deposed in 1974. Muslims are important in the business community. They tend to live in the eastern, southern, and western lowlands, although there are considerable numbers in Addis Ababa.

Etiquette and Customs in Ethiopia Meeting Etiquette

- Ethiopian greetings are courteous and somewhat formal.
- The most common form of greeting is a handshake with direct eye contact.
- The handshake is generally much lighter

- than in Western cultures.
- After a close personal relationship has been established people of the same sex may kiss three times on the cheeks.
- Across genders, men should wait to see if a woman extends her hand.
- Greetings should never be rushed. Take time to inquire about the person's family, health, job, etc.
- People are addressed with their honorific title and their first name.

"Ato", "Woizero", and "Woizrity" are used to address a man, married woman, and unmarried woman respectively.

-Elders should be greeted first.

-It is customary to bow when introduced to someone who is obviously older or has a more senior position. Children will often be seen doing so.

Dress

The Ethiopian traditional costume is made of woven cotton. Ethiopian men and women wear this traditional costume called gabbi or Netella. Women often wear dresses (Kemis) and netella with borders of colored embroidered woven crosses, but other designs are also used.

How to Green Clean the Grout in Your Bathroom

The word grout sounds inappropriate and the bright white stuff shows every little blemish. It is porous, hard to get to, easily stains, the list goes on. But worry less; here we have some helpful tips to make your smallest favorite chore a little more bearable.

You need the following:

- Baking Soda
- Vinegar
- Hydrogen peroxide (optional)
- Spray bottle
- Grout brush or scrub brush (a toothbrush works as well!)
- Small bowl

Instructions

Start with vinegar

Fill your spray bottle with a 1:1 solution of vinegar and water and spray the work area generously. Let the solution sit for about five minutes, then follow up with a grout brush or a scrub brush. If you don't have one of these, a toothbrush works in a pinch. Rinse with warm water.

Add baking soda

In a small bowl, make a paste with baking soda and water. Dip your toothbrush or grout brush in the paste and work it into the grout. Spray the area with your vinegar + water solution. The vinegar will cause the baking soda to bubble up and will start to work away that nasty soap scum. Use your brush and get all the way into the grout lines to remove buildup. Rinse with warm water.



There are a number of extraordinary baobabs in the Makgadikgadi area but the ones most worth visiting are Chapman's and Green's baobabs in Ntwetwe Pan and Baines Baobabs in Nxai Pans National Park.

In the days of early European explorers, a small pan beside this baobab was filled with perennial water, giving the great old tree special significance as a beacon of hope that signaled a spot to replenish supplies after a long trek through the saltpans. The intrepid Green brothers were one of the many early

traders, hunters and explorers to carve their names here, leaving "Green's Expedition 1858–1859" scrawled into the tree's bark and giving the tree its name. The tree is now one of Botswana's National Monuments. Baobab trees can live for thousands of years and this one certainly bears the battle scars to prove it, gunshot wounds included.

The enormous Chapman's baobab, six km to the north of Gutsha pan, was the first landmark to be seen by travelers crossing the lonely saltpans. The tree was noted by many early explorers, including David

Livingstone (who past here with George Oswell in the 1860's on the way to Linyanti), for its astonishing size, a circumference of 25 metres. In his journal Livingstone wrote, "About 2 miles beyond the northern bank of the pan we unyoked under a fine specimen of the baobab called in the language of the Bechuanas, Morwana: it consisted of 6 branches united into one trunk." James Chapman, after whom the tree was named. was a South African explorer and hunter and left his name on one of the trees enormous roots when he passed by with the artist Thomas Baines in the

1860s. A hollow in the tree also served as an ancient letterbox. Unfortunately, this legendary baobab fell down in January 2006 but is still a very impressive sight in its collapsed state, and travelers should visit it sooner rather than later before the tree decays. For those who don't want to camp, Uncharted Africa have a selection of lodges nearby that offer day trips to visit the Baobab and visitors can explore it by clambering about on the giant's collapsed limbs.

Located in the south of Nxai Pans National Park are the seven baobabs known as Baines Baobabs. This stunted cluster of Africa's most iconic tree was immortalized by the paintings of Thomas Baines, a British landscape artist commissioned by the Royal Geographic Society. Baines camped beneath these trees in 1862 en route to the Victoria Falls. The pans at Baines Baobabs are dry and bare for much of the year, as are the branches of the baobabs themselves, but during wet season the pans are covered in sheets of water and green canopies emerge from tree's branches.



Tell us about your relationship with Han-C?

It started when I posted a video on facebook. He had just released a song with Mvzzle from South Africa, so I posted a video of me making fun of the

song, he saw it and commented on my page complimenting me for my singing. Ah I was star struck, I forgot myself that day. Then a friend of mine, Just J.O replied the comment with the link to my music, shout out to him. After the Han-C comment there, now came a comment from Dato Seiko, am now here like whooa... Jikijiki the guy calls me, and that time am in a combi, and am speaking to Han-C. I almost told this girl who was sitting next to me gore "heei, am speaking to Han-C here..." haha. And we kicked it from there, he introduced me to a few people in the industry, including Raptured Roots, who I work with a lot currently. So the other time I was an intern at Roc Lefatshe and we were hosting the rehearsals for Han-c for a SKY project and I got to work with them closely and got introduced to a lot of people.

Still on the Roc Lefatshe tip, is it true Suffocate, the owner, almost or wanted to sign you?

I guess they should... hahaha!



Withdraw from Conflict



When do babies start teething?

Most babies grow their first tooth when they're between 4 and 7 months old. An early developer may get his first tooth as early as 3 months, while it may take a late bloomer until he's a year old or more. Whenever your baby's first tooth makes its appearance, celebrate this by taking pictures.

Teeth actually start developing while your baby is in the womb and tooth buds form in the gums. Teeth break through over a period of months, and they often appear in this order: the bottom two middle teeth first, then the top two middle ones, then those along the sides and back.

Teeth can erupt one at a time, or several can come through at once. They may not all come in straight, but don't worry because they usually straighten out over time. The last teeth to appear, found in the very back of the mouth on the top and bottom usually come in around your baby's second birthday or in the months after. By the age of 3, your child should have a full set of 20 baby teeth. and they shouldn't start to fall out until his permanent teeth are ready to start coming in.

What are the signs of baby teething?

Some babies get through teething with no signs at all, but many parents report that their babies do experience discomfort. The most likely signs of teething include: irritability or fussiness, swollen and sensitive gums, chewing behavior, refusing to eat and trouble sleeping.

How can I help my teething baby feel better?


- Give your child something to chew on, like a firm rubber teething ring
- Rub a clean finger gently but firmly over your baby's sore gums to ease the pain temporarily


Sheep Farming

rom way back, sheep have been raised for the purpose of generating an income for both the farm and family needs. While some farms make a majority of their income from raising sheep, sheep production is more often a secondary enterprise on a farm. Sheepraising compliments many other agricultural enterprises. It is a popular enterprise for many part-time and lifestyle farmers. Sheep production is considered a good activity for youth and pensioners, it can also be enjoyable to them. Sheep are easier to handle than larger livestock and the investment in breeding stock, equipment, and facilities is usually much less than for other enterprises.

Feeding and watering of sheep

For almost all livestock enterprises, feeders are a necessity. Feeding on the ground results in considerable feed wastage and contributes to the spread of disease, especially internal parasites and abortion. Properly constructed feeders help to minimize feed wastage. Choose feeders that can be hung on the side of the fence, then removed after the sheep have finished eating. Sheep can be fed silage, hay or baleage.


lean, fresh water is a daily necessity for sheep and lambs. Sheep prefer to drink still water as opposed to water from a moving stream. Remember that requirements increase greatly during late gestation and lactation. Water intake is positively correlated to feed intake. Sometimes, sheep will seem to drink very little water. This is probably because they are consuming feeds or forages that are sufficiently high in moisture content. As the grass gets drier or their diet gets drier, they will consume more water.

Simply collect some berries from a mistletoe plant and rub them into the cracks of the bark then let the mistletoe flourish from your tree's nutrients.

Round off the season by sowing plants for next year, sow summer flowering seeds and vegetable seeds to be harvested next autumn. Turn it into a family activity this winter, kids love growing from seed. Peas are perfect because of their quick results and they are great fun to pick and shell.



Fruit and Vegetables

it's time to plant new Fruit Trees. December is your last chance to plant fruit trees and bushes, secure the tree loosely to its stake to prevent it from being dislodged from the ground and remember to water when the weather is dry.

Gather up all your beanpoles, canes and another veg supports from your garden so they don't deteriorate over winter. Clean off any soil and leave them undercover, ready for next spring. Gather the last harvest, now is the final time to pick the fruit that is left and bring it indoors. Leave parsnips in the ground because they taste much better after the frosts. Tomatoes are unlikely to ripen further, bring them inside and put them next to a banana to ripen them quickly. Another way to use unripe tomatoes is to make green tomato chutney, perfect for eating on Christmas day, and even as presents.
